













<p><b>BLACK DUSTBIN</b></p> <p>Emptied every 2 or 4 weeks</p>	<p><b>BIO DUSTBIN</b></p> <p>Emptied every 2 weeks, from June to September every week</p>	<p><b>YELLOW BAG/ DUSTBIN</b> packing materials</p> <p>Emptied every 2 weeks</p>	<p><b>PAPER / CARDBOARD</b></p> <p>Emptied every 4 weeks or collections by organizations or recycling/ material yards</p>	<p><b>GLASS</b></p> <p>Containers in every municipality or recycling yard</p>

Crystal, plate glass, oven-proof glass, mirrors, ceramics, clay pots or porcelain in the black dustbin!</p>
